EDITORS COMMENTS

But before any further action is taken, it has been decided to provide a complete and comprehensive briefing at our Business meeting during the Reunion. After the briefing a question and answer session will be conducted, and subsequently a vote to determine if we should initiate the affiliation. The following was provided for your information by Kevin McCutcheon:

During the Business Meeting at last year's Reunion held in Myrtle Beach, SC, a discussion was initiated that addressed a number a key issues impacting ALM and how it should operate going forward. Highlights of that discussion, are herein provided:

Efforts to become a recognized MCAA Squadron

ALM Organization and Membership Update Marines,

* Formalizing ALM as a more recognizable social-professional organization

- * Broadening participation and membership in ALM and associated planned activities

 * Broaden affiliations with Marine aviation active-duty and ALM Community of Interest (COI)

 constituents
 - * Consideration to pursue COI sponsors to support various ALM functions and objectives

A recommendation was made to have our ALM group be established as a Marine Corps Aviation Association (MCAA) Squadron. Rationale for such a recommendation was provided that addressed how each of the highlights above could be made most achievable with such an affiliation. Action was taken by **Kevin McCutcheon (myself) and Paul Cerkez** to investigate this recommendation further.

MCAA leadership (LtGen, (ret) Keith Stalder (Cmdr), Col. (ret) Scott Leitch (DCmdr)) were contacted and an ALM background was communicated. MCAA embraced the recommendation enthusiastically, and basic requirements were set forth for establishing a new squadron. Documents were crafted under the counsel of a proposed slate of ALM squadron officers, me being one of them. Highlights below.

- * ALM By-Laws have been fully-developed and have been reviewed by MCAA leadership and staff
 - * Squadron name, logo and final documents are under final consideration by MCAA * It is anticipated that final approval would come prior to our annual event at the Villages

That said, regardless of whether we have that approval or not, a general assembly (at our ALM reunion) briefing, plenary discussion and vote will be required before we fully-formalized as a MCAA squadron. Full disclosure will happen at our reunion, as there are a number of compliance requirements under such a charter.

More to follow for sure.




