

The third annual AVLOG Off-site was held at DLA Aviation in Richmond, VA from 31 Jul to 2 Aug. Over 150 participants from all four Marine Aircraft Wings, NAVSUP WSS, HQMC, and Program Management teams attended. The 2 1/2 day event brought together aviation logistics Marines from every community -Supply, Maintenance, Avionics, Ordnance, and ALIMS. The purpose of the off-site was twofold - get together to build relationships and to discuss actionable ways to reduce non mission capable supply issues. The theme of the off-site was "Relationships Build Readiness." Additionally, Col Manuel and LTCOL Bill Slack supported by Don Fincham gave a short presentation on the Don Davis Squadron and the benefits of being member.
